Sports Premium Provision 2014/15

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is going directly to Primary Schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all the children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding:

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional after school clubs.
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport.
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport.
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games.
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

Increasing participation in school sport and providing opportunities for the children to compete:	<p>The school has bought into the Primary School Sports Partnership which means that we:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work closely with our local secondary school and other local primary schools in our area. • Have the services of a school sports co-ordinator. Part of their role is to arrange tournaments and fixtures for our children to compete in. This involves all the children, with Key Stage 1 children taking part in multiskills activities with other schools and KS2 children taking part in cross country events, dance mat competitions and football. • They will also provide a coach for after school clubs in eg Tag rugby. • Year 5 and 6 children are trained to become sports leaders and lead multiskills activities for the children in Years 1 to 4. • Some children in Years 3 and 4 have engaged with 'Sporty Maths' to support their learning in mathematics. 	£2100.00

Impact from the use of the Sports Premium 2014-15:

- Children throughout the school have developed team playing skills in football, and dodgeball.
- There has been a positive impact on children, helping them to deal with possible conflict when playing games, especially football in the playground at playtime and lunchtime.
- Qualified sports coaches have worked alongside teachers which has had a positive impact as the children are being taught by specialist coaches. It has also had the impact of enabling teachers to develop their skills through sharing good practice.
- Sporting clubs have enabled children to experience new sports eg fencing and dodgeball.
- Sporting clubs have enabled children to develop the skills to take part in competitions with other schools eg cheerleading.
- Through buying into the Primary School Sports Partnership we have worked closely with our local secondary school and this has had the positive impact of them regularly visiting our local secondary schools and preparing them for their transition to secondary school
- Through buying into the Primary School Sports Partnership we have taken part in inter school competitions eg cross country and multiskills
- Through buying into the Primary School Sports Partnership targeted children have been able to access activities such as sporty maths to motivate them and engage them in their learning.
