What is the Sports Premium?

A government provided fund aimed at supporting schools in improving the quality of sports and PE. The premium is for all the children and is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is paid directly to schools.

What is the purpose of the funding?

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional after school clubs
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

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| Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside KS1 and 2 teachers when teaching PE. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A coach (Premier Sports) will work alongside teachers to develop sports skills throughout the school, focusing on developing their games skills and then holding an intra-school tournament. This should have a positive impact on developing their team playing skills and will help pupils to deal with possible conflict when playing football in the playground. Each class will have 2 workshops with the coach, leading to a tournament day. • The aim is for children to benefit from being taught by specialist coaches and teacher to develop their skills in the teaching of PE. This could be done through the sharing of good practice and assisting in the PE sessions. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children participate in an intra-school sports tournament. • Teachers are more confident and competent to deliver PE and sports through development work with coaches. | £5,616 |

| <p>Increasing participation in school sport and providing opportunities for the children to compete.</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The school has bought into the Primary School Sports Partnership, which means that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We will work closely with our local secondary school and other local primary schools in our area to develop sporting opportunities for all pupils. We will employ the services of a school sports co-ordinator, who will arrange tournaments and fixtures for our children to compete in, both intra and inter school. The partnership provides CPD for teachers to enhance provision within the school. The partnership also provides a block of after school clubs in a chosen sport. Year 5 and 6 children are trained to become sports leaders and lead multiskills activities for the children in years 1-4. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children take part in competitions and tournaments across the borough. As a result of this participation, past pupils from Grange have come with their local secondary schools to lead as sports leaders, working with pupils across the school. Teachers become highly skilled in teaching sport effectively through CPD and team-teaching provided. | £2,500 |
| <p>G+T Sports provision</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Targeted sessions one afternoon a week for identified gifted and talented pupils in a range of sports, delivered by a sports coach. Working with 'A team' pupils to ensure success at inter-school competitions. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gifted and talented pupils are stretched and challenged in the sports that they excel at. Opportunities to enter into both recreational and semi-professional clubs for talented pupils are identified and parents/pupils are supported in this. | £1,276.08 |
