



What is the Sports Premium?

A government provided fund aimed at supporting schools in improving the quality of sports and PE. The premium is for all the children and is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is paid directly to schools.

Purpose of funding:

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional after school clubs.
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport.
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport.
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games.
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE.	 A coach (Premier Sport) will work alongside teachers to develop sports skills throughout the school focusing on developing their games skills and then holding an intra-school tournament. This should have a positive impact on developing their team playing skills and will help pupils to deal with possible conflict when playing football in the playground. 6 sports activities will be included (1 each half term). Each class will have 2 workshops with the coach, leading to a tournament day. A coach (Premier Sport) will work alongside class teachers to develop Sports Days and develop the Olympic theme for the whole school. Two football coaches from (Ironworks) will come in and work alongside the teachers in the EYFS developing the children's ball skills and their physical development. 	 The aim is for children to benefit from being taught by specialist coaches and teachers to develop their skills of teaching PE. This could be done through the sharing of good practice and assisting in the PE sessions. 		
Providing sporting opportunities at after school clubs:	 Children will have the opportunity to develop their skills to a higher level. All pupils will be encouraged to take part in these sports with their coaches in the community on other evenings and at weekend's e.g. cheerleading, football and basketball. The cheerleading team will have the opportunity to compete in a Newham competition. 	Pupil premium children from each year group are targeted for after school football training throughout the year. Pupil premium children are identified for cheerleading and participate in interschool competitions each term.	£1500.00
Increasing participation in school sport and providing opportunities for the children to compete:	 The school has bought into the Primary School Sports Partnership which means that: We will work closely with our local secondary school and other local primary schools in our area. We will employ the services of a school sports co-ordinator, who will arrange tournaments and fixtures for our children to compete in. This involves all the children; key stage 1 children will take part in multiskills activities with other schools and key stage 2 children will take part in cross country events, dance mat competitions and football. We will also provide a coach for after school clubs e.g. Tag rugby. Year 5 and 6 children are trained to become sports leaders and lead multiskills activities for the children in Years 1 to 4. Some children in Years 3 and 4 have engaged with 'Sporty Maths' to support their learning in mathematics. 	Pupil premium take part in competitions and tournaments across the borough. As a result of this participation, past pupils from Grange have come with their local secondary schools to lead as sports leaders whilst working with pupils across the school. Participation on sporty maths is targeted to pupil premium children and is based on gaps in their learning.	£2500.00

Sustainability

Premier Sports provide the same coach throughout the year to work closely with the staff and children. This helps to ensure that continuity and progression are built into the planning and delivery of additional PE lessons. PE lessons and clubs are timetabled to ensure that sufficient time is allocated for physical activity. We also have a number of after-school sports clubs available. Children who join our cheerleading team stay within that team from year 4 to year 6; this has been successful as they have previously gone on to participate in local Newham team competitions. We are fortunate to have links with local secondary schools and the children are able to access Eastlea Secondary School facilities. This works well as it also improves transition from primary into secondary school.
