What is the Sports Premium?

A government provided fund aimed at supporting schools in improving the quality of sports and PE. The premium is for all the children and is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is paid directly to schools.

What is the purpose of the funding?

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending after school clubs
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

#### Impact report:

Sports premium funding has had a positive impact on the development of sports participation and attainment at Grange Primary School because:

- More children have been able to attend sporting competitions due to the employment of a sports coach
- Pupils are attaining well at sports competitions due to the employment of a sports coach, as well as lunchtime and afterschool sports provision, which has developed their skills
- The school has achieved the Gold School Games Mark for the year 2017-2018
- Internal tracking data shows that the least active population are more readily engaged in sports, predominantly due to lunchtime sports provision
- Pupils are attaining well in PE due to the provision of suitable and safe equipment in order to develop skills

#### Sustainability:

Sports Premium funding has been used in a sustainable way at Grange Primary School because:

- The outdoors sports cage is an investment, which has been partially funded by sports premium. This will allow the safe participation of all pupils in sport for years to come
- A culture of competition has been ingrained at Grange Primary School due to the involvement with the school sports partnership
- The school sports partnership and an external company provide team teaching opportunities for staff across the school. This has supported teachers' subject knowledge and pedagogy and will have a lasting impact on the quality of PE and sports provision within the school.

#### Swimming and Water Safety:

- Within our current year 6 cohort:
  - 21 pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 meters.
  - 18 pupils can use a range of strokes effectively.
  - 24 pupils can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
