Spring Term 2

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to a new term at Grange Primary School. We have lots of exciting learning ready for your children this term! Nursery and Reception will be following a unit of work on a theme that focuses on 'The Great Outdoors'.

During this unit we will focus on:

<p>Our class reading books this term will be –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oliver's Vegetables • A seed in need • The Very Hungry Caterpillar 	
<p>Communication, Language and Literacy</p>	<p>Maths</p>
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in conversation or discussion. • To use talk to organise, sequence and clarify ideas, feelings and events. • To explore a range of books. • To read words and simple sentences. • To write short sentences in meaningful contexts. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To make 10 (number bonds). • To add two numbers (single-digit) by using objects and counting on to find the answer. • To subtract two numbers (single-digit) by using objects and counting back to find the answer. • To record a number sentence using marks they can interpret and explain. • To use mathematical language and terms to describe 2D and 3D shapes. • To recognise, create and describe patterns.
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p>	<p>Understanding the World</p>
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To select tools and techniques needed to shape, assemble and join materials they are using. • To introduce a storyline or narrative in their play. • To play cooperatively as part of a group to act out a narrative. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To show care and concern for living things and the environment. • To look closely at similarities, differences and change in relation to objects and living things. • To select and use technology for particular purposes.
<p>Physical</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional</p>
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The importance of good health. • To try a variety of food. • To design a healthy meal. • To be aware that some food can be unhealthy. • That our body needs a variety of food, exercise, hygiene and sleeping to keep healthy. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To play cooperatively, taking turns with others. • To confidently speak about their ideas within a familiar group. • To understand that own actions affect other people.
