Dear Parents,

Welcome to a new term at Grange Primary School. We have lots of exciting learning ready for your children this term! Reception will be following a unit of work on a theme that focuses on 'Traditional Tales'.

During this half term, we will focus on:

Our class reading books this term will be –

- Jack and The Beanstalk
- The Three Billy Goats Gruff
- The Enormous Turnip

We will also be reading a variety of non-fiction texts to help us explore more about traditional tales.

Communication and Language	Personal, Social and Emotional
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To be able to articulate their ideas and thoughts in well-formed sentences. * To be able to describe events in some detail. * To be able to use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities. * To be able to express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences. * To be able to participate in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering their own ideas, using recently introduced vocabulary. * To know and be able to use the new vocabulary taught in topic in discussions and play. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To be able to think about the perspectives of others. * To be able to manage their own needs. * To know about and show understanding of their own feelings and those of others and begin to regulate their behaviour accordingly. * To be able to set and work towards simple goals. * To be confident to try new activities and be able to explore different ways of doing things. * To be able to explain the reasons for rules and know right from wrong.
Maths	Understanding the World
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *To match number to quantity. *To understand and use one more and one less. *To know number bonds to 10. *To identify odd and even numbers. *To complete addition to 10. *To complete subtraction within 10. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To understand the important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including changing states of matter. * To know and understand the important processes and changes in the natural world. * To be able to compare the past and present through story settings. * To be able to compare the past and present through characters (clothes/image). * To be able to describe what they see, hear, and feel whilst outside.

Physical	Expressive Arts and Design
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To know and refine a range of ball skills including throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming. * To be able to develop confidence and competence. * To develop precision, and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball. * To be able to develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient. * To develop fine motor skills-holding pencil correctly, using scissors etc. 	<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To know a repertoire of songs- nursery, topical, seasonal. * To be able to create collaboratively sharing ideas, resources, and skills. * To be able to use props and role play to tell stories and act out narratives in play. * To know that they can use their voices whilst acting to create a dramatic affect. * To be able to experiment with colour, design, texture, form and function. * To make props and to retell traditional tales.
<p>Literacy</p>	
<p>The children will be learning the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * To be able to read words consistent with their phonic knowledge. * To be able to form lower-case and capital letters correctly. * To be able to segment and spell words and write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others. * To be able to anticipate (where appropriate) key events in stories. * To be able to write sentences and continue to build an awareness of capital letters full stops and finger spaces when writing sentences. * To begin to be able to draw and innovate story maps from well-known stories. 	
<p>Important Information – PE days, Educational Visits, Home Learning Task</p>	
<p><u>PE</u> All children will continue with weekly football coaching with our school sports lead. Please send your child with trainers/plimsolls in their bag to change into on a Tuesday.</p> <p><u>Home Learning Tasks</u> Pencil control/Phonics and maths homework will be sent home every Tuesday and needs to be returned on Mondays. Your child will also have a reading book sent home weekly, as well as a loan book from the school library.</p> <p><u>Educational Visit</u> We are hoping to visit a local park to aid the children's' learning about the natural world. Details will be sent out nearer the time.</p> <p><u>Reminders</u> Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform. Please also label all clothing. Please make sure your child has a labelled water bottle with them every day. As the weather is changing, it is advisable to provide your child with appropriate clothing and apply sun cream on warmer days.</p>
