What is the Sports Premium?

A government provided fund aimed at supporting schools in improving the quality of sports and PE. The premium is for all the children and is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is paid directly to schools.

What is the purpose of the funding?

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending after school clubs
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

Due to the Pandemic (COVID), schools were not able to achieve all of its objects and some of the sports premium will be carried over

Impact report:

Sports premium funding has had a positive impact on the development of sports participation and attainment at Grange Primary School because:

- More children have been able to attend sporting competitions due to the employment of a sports coach at the start of the academic year but this has been halted due to COVID
- Pupils were beginning to attain well in sports competitions due to the employment of a sports coach, as well as lunchtime and afterschool sports provision, which has developed their skills
- The school has retained the Gold School Games Mark for the year 2019-20 but COVID has prevented the school from participating at competition level
- Internal tracking data shows that the least active population are more readily engaged in sports, predominantly due to lunchtime and afterschool sports provision – halted due to the Pandemic
- Pupils are attaining well in PE due to the provision of suitable and safe equipment in order to develop skills – halted due to the Pandemic
- NSSP support from secondary school paused as a result of COVID-19
- One CPD event attended by PE lead/Sports coach
- Unable to provide staff training in a practical way
- Competitions & fixture events postponed due to the Pandemic
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**Achievements:**

- Sports coach provide support and advice via email
- Some competitions took place via Zoom
- Activities highlighted in green were achieved

- Activities highlighted amber were partially achieved
- Activities highlighted red were not achieved due to the pandemic

Swimming and Water Safety:

In addition, the school has allocated a budget towards swimming:

- £538 – SEND
- £1110

Year 6 children were unable to meet the swimming statements as all pools were closed due to the Pandemic

- Pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25meters.
- Pupils can use a range of strokes effectively.
- Pupils can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
