What is the Sports Premium?

A government provided fund aimed at supporting schools in improving the quality of sports and PE. The premium is for all the children and is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The money is paid directly to schools.

What is the purpose of the funding?

Possible uses for the funding are:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending after school clubs
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions and increasing participation in school games
- Providing places for pupils on after school clubs and holiday clubs.

Impact report:

Sports premium funding has had a positive impact on the development of sports participation and attainment at Grange Primary School because:

- Children continue to attend sporting competitions due to the employment of a sports coach despite the pandemic, it has been possible to compete with local schools in outdoor football matches and participate in NSSP led sports activities via Zoom
- Pupils are attaining well at sports competitions due to the employment of a sports coach, including lunchtime but part of the offer has been halted due to the pandemic.

- Opportunities have continued outdoors with bubbles having access to coaching throughout the week to ensure all groups receive some form of physical activity including SEN groups
- This has had a positive impact on pupil wellbeing as well as engagement and cooperation in getting active.
- Pupils have participated in fitness Friday with the PE coach and there has been an increase in pupils walking, cycling and scooting.
- The school has retained the Gold School Games Mark

Sustainability:

Sports Premium funding has been used in a sustainable way at Grange Primary School because:

- The outdoors multisport area continues to be a long-term investment that enables pupils to enjoy the safe participation of sports both at lunchtime and after school sports premium. This will allow the safe participation of all pupils in sport for years to come
- A culture of competition has continued to be inbedded at Grange Primary School due to the involvement with NSSP
- The school sports partnership and an external company provide team teaching opportunities for staff ~~at~~ the school. This has supported teachers' subject knowledge and pedagogy and will have a lasting impact on the quality of PE and sports provision within the school.

Swimming and Water Safety:
