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Nursery 2-Year Old Curriculum Newsletter Summer Term 2

Dear Parents,

Welcome to a new term at Grange Primary School. We have lots of exciting learning resources ready for your children this term! Our two-year- old provision will be following a unit of work on a theme that focuses on 'Under the Sea'.

During this term, we will focus on:

We will also be reading a variety of non-fiction texts to help us explore more of 'Under The Sea'.

 To be able to understand and act on longer sentences like make teddy jump or find your coat. To be able to understand and use simple questions about 'who', 'what' and 'where'. To be able to listen to simple stories and understand what is happening, with the help of the pictures. To identify familiar objects and properties, when they are described by practitioners. For example: 'Hassan's coat', 'blue car', 'shiny apple'. To be able to talk about their feelings in more elaborated ways: "I'm sad because" or "I love it when" To be able to develop independence to try to do things by themselves.

Literacy		
The children will be learning the following:		
 -To be able to notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or a familiar logo. (Recognises important prints to me). -To be able to sing songs and say rhymes independently, For example, singing whilst playing. -To know and have favourite books and seeks them out, to share with an adult, with another child, or to look at alone. -To be able to make marks on their picture to stand for their name (recognise important prints to me). 		
Important Information		
Nursery rhymes/songs		
It is really important at this young age that the children are exposed to lots of language and singing can help with this. We hope that you will support your child at home with songs around the theme 'Under the Sea".		
Song suggestions:		
-Let's Go to the Sea song -Five Little Fish song -Ten Little Fish song -Colour Fish song		
Educational Visit		
We will be going on a local walk to the park, as well as holding a family picnic (Letter with date and details to follow).		
Sunny weather		
We have a lot of outdoor learning. Please ensure your child has suitable clothing for the weather. We are hoping for nice, sunny weather this summer – in the event of hot weather, please apply sun cream to your child before bringing them to school along with a sun hat to wear outdoor.		
Self-care and Toilet training		
We are continuing to work on self-care skills, e.g. hand washing and putting on our own coats and shoes. Please support your child at home by encouraging him/her to complete basic skills a little more independently. In warmer weather, you could leave your child in underpants when you are at home. Please continue to encourage your children to begin potty training. Try to make toileting part of your child's regular routine. For example, encourage your child to use the potty or toilet in the morning, and before or after snacks and meals. Praise your child for trying. You could say, 'Well done for sitting on the potty'. Gradually reduce the praise as your child masters each part of the process. Dress your child in clothes that are easy to take off – for example, trousers with elastic waistbands. Well done to the children that have already started potty training! Our goal is to help each child reach his/her fullest potential in all areas and this includes independent toileting.
