Welcome to a new term at Grange Primary School. We have lots of exciting learning ready for your children this term! Year 2 will be following a unit of work entitled "On Safari!"

E.g. number of sides, corners and faces Number Children will recap all areas of number previously taught Children will begin a programme of revision in preparation for KS1 SATs
